Exempted Codeine Preparations e.g. 222® Tylenol #1 Robinussin® with codeine	Must contain 8 mg codeine phosphate or equivalent/tablet or 20 mg/30 ml and either 2 non-narcotics, one at therapeutic dose or each at ½ dose or three other ingredients, one at therapeutic dose or three at 1/3 dose.	No prescription required but pharmacist must be active in ALL sales.	NO REPEATS <u>Part Fills</u> Part Fills are allowed if prescriber states in writing, OR verbally, the total quantity of drug to be dispensed and the quantity of each part fill for a specific interval. Prescriptions <u>cannot</u> be transferred to another pharmacy.	Record acquisition in Narcotic Register (green pages), or similar record. Sales report not required.	Prescription for exempted codeine preparations filed with Narcotic prescriptions.	Store out of public view. Loss or theft must be reported to Health Canada, the MPHA & local police within 10 days.
Narcotic Preparations (Verbal prescription narcotics) – all those N preparations not covered by M3P. e.g. Tylenol #3	A combination, for other than parenteral use, containing only one N and two or more non- N in recognized therapeutic doses.	Written prescription signed and dated by a physician, dentist or veterinary surgeon licensed to practice in a province in Canada. OR Verbal prescription directly from prescriber to pharmacist transcribed to a written prescription by pharmacist.	Repeats on written prescription if prescriber has indicated in writing the number and intervals of repeats. Repeats on verbal order if number and interval between refills indicated at time of prescribing. Repeat PRN unacceptable. Prescriptions <u>cannot</u> be transferred to another pharmacy.	Records to be maintained in compliance with the Narcotic & Controlled Drug Accountability Guidelines.	All Narcotic prescriptions kept in a separate file in sequence of date and numbers. File must be kept for a total of 7 years. From the last date filled, a min. of 2 yrs hardcopy. The balance of 5 yrs may be kept as electronic record. Targeted/Controlled Drugs T/C e.g. diazepam midazolam meprobamate Valium® Ativan®	Drugs listed in Schedule 1091: benzodiazepines and other targeted substances.		Repeats on original written or verbal prescription authorized by prescriber. Prescriber must indicate number of refills. Repeat PRN unacceptable. Prescriptions are transferable.			
Prescription Drugs Pr e.g. tetracycline propranolol chlorpropamide	Drugs listed in Schedule F, Food and Drug Regulations and select vitamins and minerals.		Repeats on original written or verbal prescription authorized by prescriber. Prescriber must indicate number of refills. Repeat PRN unacceptable. Prescriptions are transferable.

Prescriptions written by authorized practitioners permitted to prescribe the M3P drug in other provinces and territories need only meet the requirements in place in their jurisdiction for the prescription to be filled in Manitoba.	NO REPEATS <u>Part Fills</u> Part Fills are allowed if prescriber states in writing the total quantity of drug to be dispensed and the quantity of each fill for a specific interval.	Record acquisition in Narcotic Register (green pages), or similar record.
