Interested Party

Any person, association or other entity that, in the opinion of NDSAC, has or presents a significant interest in the scheduling of a drug can request standing as an interested party. Interested party status (which may be denied or revoked by NDSAC at any time) must be obtained prior to participating in a drug scheduling review.

Alternate method of participation

Individuals, companies or organizations who chose not to pursue Interested Party status or have been denied the status, can provide comments, in writing, related to the agenda items outlined in the meeting notice. All comments must be received no later than seven (7) days prior to the start of the drug scheduling review for consideration.
